 - Project activities:**
 1. Study on needs of training and gaps in the knowledge of national Institutions and organizations in the field of prevention of radicalization, for ced extremism and hate speech;
 2. Exchange of experience with other EU Member States;
 3. Adaptation of training materials, development of training methodology and manual according to the specific needs of the target groups;
 4. Training of police officers on prevention and detection of radicalism, violent extremism and hate speech against Roma communities - Training of Trainers;
 5. Training of police officers on prevention and detection of radicalism, violent extremism and hate speech against Roma communities;
 6. Improving the conditions for reception of citizens in areas with predominant Roma population;
 7. Conducting information and awareness campaigns in various parts of the country with a predominantly Roma population to raise awareness of radicalization, violent extremism, hate speech;
 8. Organizing and conducting joint local forums with children and their parents to overcome anti-Roma stereotypes and discrimination;
 9. Organizing a competition for best student's essay on "No" to differences, "Yes" to tolerance and integration;
